Dr. Nawaf Kabbara* speech on Behalf of persons with disabilities in the world, during the closing session of the 65th UN DPI/NGO Conference: 2015 and beyond (Department of Public Information and Non-governmental Organization)

29 August, UN headquarters, New York

Let us all dream together that in the post 2015 MDG era; this great United Nations will be able to develop programs and policies based on the will of its global citizen to live in a better World based on peace, rights and equal opportunities for all.

Let us all dream that the post 2015 MDG era will help us reach a World free from poverty and marginalization and where empowering people, all people, is the goal that we all seek to achieve.

Let us all dream that water, sanitation, health care and shelter, will be available for all and that earth resources will be used in a rational manner to seek the interest not of the living people today but for future generations to come.

Let us all dream that in the post 2015 era, religions will be a force for people to get together, to spread love and acceptance and that civilizations will not be, as Rousseau perceived two hundred fifty years ago, a hopeless race to find solutions to the problems they create, but a real competition among nations to save our environment and climate from pollution and
